





How white is white?

Understanding a color is almost impossible without holding a physical sample. Your monitor distorts the color when viewing from a website. The camera and lighting used to take the original pictures affect how they are represented. You just don't know how a color looks until you see it with your own eyes (and under the correct lighting).

One trick that Vendura uses to better communicate it's colors is showing the desired color against a piece of standard white paper. All of us have access to standard 8-1/2" x 11" white paper. Understanding how a color looks *in-comparison* to white paper can help you understand a colors hue. Secondly, showing several colors together, on white paper, can further help the user understand the tones and hues *in-comparison* to eachother. Again, the colors are still distorted by your monitor, the original camera, the original lighting, but *the comparison* between the colors can be seen.

This trick doesn't replace physical samples, but it does help you make decision when time is of the essence and you don't have physical samples.
